## Presidents Report 2017 - 2018

It is with much pleasure that I present this report on the activities of the Eaglehawk Recycle Shop Inc. for the year 2017-18

This enterprise continues to be a hub for recycling for the Bendigo Subregion with approximately 10,083 tonnes of recyclable material saved from going to landfill during the past year.

Fortunately the market and prices for metals has risen slightly, although cardboard has remained the same for a large part of the year. All back pay owing, as a consequence of paying our staff at the same rate as our predecessor, was paid by mid financial year. However with sound management, ERS finances continue in the black with long service, annual leave and maintenance reserves all accounted for.

New equipment including a forklift, backhoe/front end loader and oil retrieval station with bunded tanks has all improved efficiency whilst meeting OHS requirements. A large paper/cardboard baler has been purchased and will be operating shortly. Consequently the old backhoe, forklift and spare Hilux ute were sold.

Unfortunately a small part of the ERS called Revamp Computers had to be closed as the business just did not meet any of its targets. As has been said before "We are a not for profit organization but we are also a not for loss organization."

ERS has an excellent rapport with the City of Greater Bendigo (the landlords). Both organizations continually strive to reduce recyclable materials going into landfill. Over the past year there have been many meetings working towards further strategies to manage the expected rise and diversity of recyclables coming into the system since the closure of many waste streams going to China. There have been several visiting council representatives from the Loddon Mallee region and most of the City of Greater Bendigo Councillors and senior staff have attended the site on fact finding missions. Schools, kindergartens and other organisations are encouraged to tour the facility during the year. Sustainability Victoria spent an afternoon at ERS in August.

Our staff, led by General Manager Peter Buck with assistance from Annette Wiles Administration Manager and Shane Hogan Assistant Manager, continue to service our customers with polite and friendly service with a focus towards educating the clientele on how they can save their money by pre sorting their loads and making most use of ERS facilities. As new management procedures and opportunities take place they are quickly endorsed as we strive towards best practice in the industry.

Management is continually seeking customers for our products, and as there has been a glut in recycled goods, there is a continuing effort to find new outlets. As part of our advertising strategy, schools and clubs are invited to group visit the centre, a new web site has been constructed and pamphlet give aways produced. The back of a Bendigo Transit Bus has been sign written with ERS information. The decision to continue with this form of advertising will be decided each year.

The Board welcomed former banker and small business owner Mr. Dean Pearce as a new Director to the board of ERS. We look forward to Dean's input to further enhance and strengthen our business.

Unfortunately due to pressure of his business Mr. Murray Gray resigned from the ERS Board at the end of the 2016-17 year. We thank Murray for the time he spent with us, his guidance during our start up phase and for the 2 years he spent with ERS as a Board Member.

### General Managers Report 2017 - 2018

The Management Team of The Eaglehawk Recycle Shop (ERS) are proud to report on another successful year of reduction of waste to landfill through its recycling and the sale of product diverted from landfill during 2017-2018

The sales shop alone has seen approximately 50,000 paying customers during the year, this would be roughly a third of people coming through the gates who come for inspiration and ideas and also to find out more about what recycling services are available in the area.

The drop off area would see approximately 150 vehicles a day delivering a wide variety of items ranging from a handful of batteries to larger items such as boats, trailers. It is mind boggling the many and varied items received on a daily basis.

The year has seen our staff onsite increase, with additional hours given to current staff members and the employment of new staff members.

The 2017-18 year saw over 10,000 tonnes of product diverted from landfill, this is an increase on last year's diversion.

There has also been an increase in site tours with schools wanting to know how the recycle centre works and what is received here. Staff from other councils also arrange tours to see how ERS operates and how they can set up a similar centre in their shires to reduce their waste to landfill.

We would like to acknowledge the City of Greater Bendigo's Resource Recovery and Education Department for the assistance they have given ERS throughout the year. The Management Team and staff would like to thank our Board of Directors for volunteering their time and expertise in the overall management of this enterprise, their knowledge in their fields of expertise is a great benefit to the running of the Eaglehawk Recycle Shop.





# EAGLEHAWK RECYCLE SHOP INC. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements cover Eaglehawk Recycle Shop Inc. as an individual entity incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria) and Regulations.

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the entity is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria) and Regulations.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the committee have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

#### **Accounting Policies**

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

#### Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Association to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### <u>Depreciation</u>

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a diminishing value and capital improvements at prime cost basis over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset was held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

The depreciation rates and useful lives used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted if appropriate at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the assets carrying amount is greater that it's estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the income statement. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

#### (c) Leases

Leases of fixed assets where substantially all the risk and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership that are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments. Including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives under operating leases are recognised as a liability and amortised on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

#### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the balance date

Contributions are made by the association to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

#### (e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

#### (f) Comparative figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

#### (h) Going Concern

The financial statements of the association have been prepared on the going concern basis. As the net assets of the association as at 30 June 2018 is in a strong position, we believe there are no going concern issues.

#### **NOTE 2 - RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES**

No members or related entity has entered into a material contract with the association. No member's fees have been paid as the positions held are on a voluntary basis.

#### **NOTE 3 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

There have been no events after the end of the financial year that would materially affect the financial statements.

#### EAGLEHAWK RECYCLE SHOP INC. STATEMENT BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity and that these special purpose financial statements should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the financial statements.
